

School Nutrition Professionals Gather Ahead of New School Year

600+ are attending the conference for education, networking, food show

St. Cloud, MN (August 3, 2022) – From August 7 - 10, 2022 approximately 600 school nutrition professionals will gather at Minnesota School Nutrition Association's (MSNA) 65th Annual Conference in preparation for another return to school with a lot of uncertainty including supply chain and staffing shortages. The Conference, held at the River's Edge Convention center in St. Cloud, features networking opportunities, education sessions, and a food show with a look at new products and equipment available for nutrition programs.

This year's keynote speakers include Kat Perkins, former contestant on NBC's hit show "The Voice" and Meteorologist Ian Leonard from Fox 9 in Minneapolis.

The MSNA Annual Conference provides an opportunity for school nutrition professionals from across the state to discuss best practices and attend educational sessions to assist them in effectively operating school meal programs. For a third year in a row, school nutrition professionals are facing challenges related to the ongoing pandemic. Staffing concerns, higher priced commodities and the changes in nutrition waivers are some of the top issues on the minds of school nutrition professionals.
