Janine Teske, 2023 Mentee

Q: What school district are you a part of and when did you begin your role as director there?

A: I started working in a dual role at the Clinton-Graceville-Beardsley Schools in February of 2023. My job is 1/2 time payroll and 1/2 time Food Service Director.

Q: What currently are your biggest challenges as a school nutrition director?

A: Mostly the lack of staffing, or people calling in sick has been my biggest challenge. Although I have over 18 years of working in a school system, Food Service was new to me.

Q: What are you most excited to learn about through this mentoring program?

A: Having someone available to ask a question to at any time and to run things by.

Q: What are some of the lessons/knowledge you've gained since beginning the program?

A: Becoming involved in SNA was a suggestion of my mentor and it was a great decision. I have learned a lot from this organization.

Q: Would you recommend the program to others?

A: Yes, having that person there if you need them helps you feel more comfortable. I know the program is new and my wish would be that there would be more outreach from the mentor to the mentee as I was not even sure where to begin to ask questions, etc.
