#### **SNA STAR CLUB**

The Star Club is SNA's way of recognizing and thanking members who recruit and retain SNA members.

How Does It Work?	Each time a new member writes your name in the referral section of the membership application form you receive one credit, plus you get an additional credit every year they renew! Credits don't expire, so once you have three credits you become a Star Club Member for as long as you are an active SNA National member!				
How Star Credits Grow	You accumulate credits when you recruit new members and get them to renew each year. For example, if you recruit 3 members this year, get all 3 to renew next year and recruit 4 more new members, you will have 10 credits in two years and become a Bronze Star.				
Star Club Recognition	As a member of SNA's Star Club, you will be recognized for your hard work and recruiting efforts throughout the year and at SNA meetings, including special recognition at the Annual National Conference. In addition, you will also receive a gift of appreciation each time you reach the next Star Club level!

Scholarship	Description			
ANC First Timer Scholarship	The ANC First-Timer Scholarship is made possible through a generous donation from AccuTemp Products. These scholarships are awarded to SNA members (employees and managers) who have never attended SNA's Annual National Conference (ANC) The \$500 scholarship may be used to cover registration and travel expenses associated with attending ANC. Twenty - \$500 scholarships are available.			
SNA Conference Scholarships	In an ongoing effort to help its members develop professionally, SNA donates funds to SNF to award scholarships to help members attend SNA's School Nutrition Industry Conference (SNIC), Legislative Action Conference (LAC), and Annual National Conference (ANC).			
Josephine Martin National Policy Fellow	Dr. Josephine Martin is a pioneer in the field of child nutrition. Launching her career at the Georgia Department of Education in 1950 as the assistant school lunch director, she soon became a vocal advocate for child nutrition, influencing legislation on the community, state and federal levels. Awards up to \$3,000 to one selected fellow to attend and be recognized at SNA's Legislative Action Conference, helping to defray travel expenses. Eligibility: Be an active SNA employee or manager section member, who has been a SNA member for at least three years, have never previously attended LAC; and have an interest in child nutrition policy			
	<b>SNA Professional Development Scholarship</b> The SNA Professional Development Scholarship is funded by a donation from SNA. Scholarships of up to \$2,500 each are awarded.
